A FYNBOS AND FOREST SANCTUARY

Flower Valley Farm – tucked away in the fynbos-covered hills close to Gansbaai and Hermanus – is the home of Flower Valley Conservation Trust.

The Trust works to promote good fynbos landscape management across the Cape Floral Kingdom. The aim? To secure our truly South African fynbos heritage for future generations.

The farm is a showcase of fynbos care. It's also a hidden treasure for nature- and outdoor-lovers.



WHY VISIT THE FLOWER VALLEY FARM?

FYNBOS: Experience a landscape covered in immense biodiversity, with some species found nowhere else on Earth.

FOREST: Enjoy the shelter of the green canopy created by the ancient trees, the fertile soil and the bubbling stream.

BIRDS: Fynbos-dependent birds like the Cape Sugarbird live here, while many birds of prey glide over our mountains.

ANIMALS: Our fynbos and forests hide animals like Duiker, Bushbuck, Otter – and not to mention our Cape Leopard.

PEOPLE: Visit our Early Learning Centre, which provides a holistic education for children aged two to six in a safe environment.



WHAT TO DO ON FLOWER VALLEY FARM

HIKE: Five hiking trails taking you through the rich, colourful and often very threatened fynbos, and into the cool shade offered by our Stinkhoutsbos Forest.

RIDE: Mountain bike rides, and the challenge to conquer Flower Valley's five peaks in one day. Very tough and technical, with sand patches and rocky hills.

LOOK: A demonstration site for good fynbos landscape management – with the fynbos picked here harvested responsibly for local and international markets.

PICNIC: A picnic hamper containing delicious and fresh snacks and drinks. Picnic in the garden or amphitheatre overlooking the Farm's rolling hills (booking essential).



PLANT: Leave your legacy in the green, lush shade of our afro-montane

forest by planting an indigenous tree, as part of our Stinkhoutsbos Forest Restoration Project.

ADVENTURE: A trip in our tractor through the fynbos, to learn more about the intricate fynbos ecosystem, enjoying a fun day breathing in the crystal clear farm air (booking essential).
